

Shortcuts to Salt Fork

Reprinted from the 1996 newsletter but still accurate.

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If you're taking I-271 to I-77, use Chef Geoff's amazing shortcut and save time!

Geoff first discovered this route during his tour of duty in Canton. Now he shares his secret on how to cut 10 - 15 minutes from your trip!

- 1.) Take I-271 south to the "Route 8, Boston Hts, Akron" exit (exit #18). TAKE ROUTE 8 SOUTH.
- 2.) Stay on route 8 south. You'll go through a few stoplights, then route 8 will become a 55 MPH expressway.
- 3.) When you get to Akron, look for the exit to I-77 south. NOTE: THIS EXIT IS A LEFT LANE EXIT!
- 4.) Take I-77 south to Salt Fork.
(See shortcut #2)

WHEN RETURNING TO CLEVELAND

- 1.) Take I-77 north to the "8 north, Cuyahoga Falls" exit (exit #125a). TAKE ROUTE 8 NORTH to I-271 NORTH.

Save time! Get off I-77 miles before the usual Salt Fork exit with Kenn's famous shortcut!

Follow these directions and you'll cut
10 - 15 minutes from your trip!

- 1.) Take I-77 south to the "Route 541, Kimbolton, Plainfield" exit (exit #54). TURN LEFT.
- 2.) Go over freeway to stop sign. TURN LEFT onto Old Twenty One Rd. (also labeled as Guernsey County Route #35).
- 3.) Travel one mile to Freedom Rd. TURN RIGHT onto Freedom Rd. (Also labeled as Guernsey County Route #851).
- 4.) Take Freedom Rd. $3\frac{1}{4}$ miles to Egress Rd. TURN RIGHT. (There's an abandoned camper supply store across from Egress Rd.) Egress Rd. is also labeled as Natural Resources Route #1.
- 5.) YOU ARE NOW IN SALT FORK STATE PARK. Take Natural Resources Route #1 until you see a sign for the cabins and you're there!
